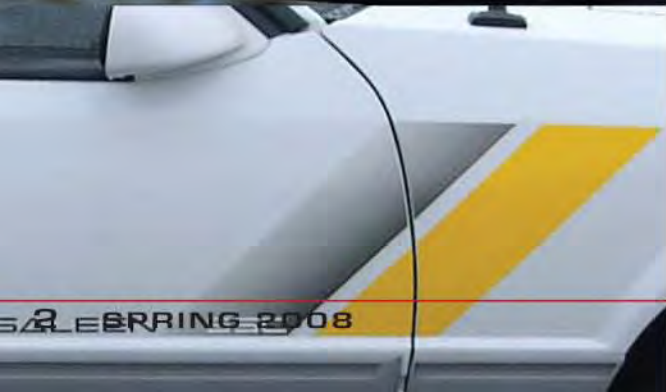
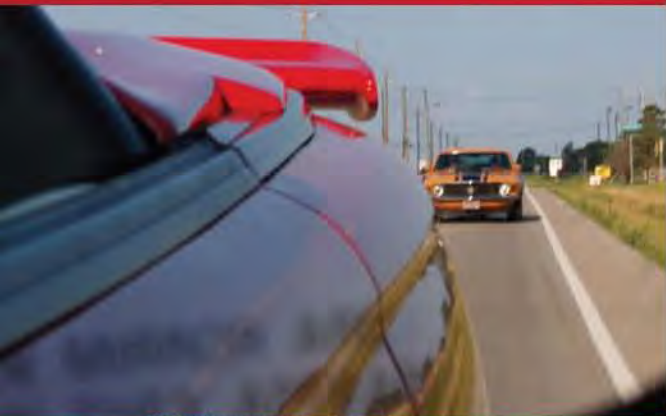

# News & Notes

## Saleen Inc Set To Preview S5S Raptor At The New York Auto Show

**March 03, 2008** - The S5S Raptor represents the first ground up vehicle to be conceived by the new Saleen management team and the most extensive demonstration of the combined capabilities of Saleen engineering and the ASC creative team.

Raptor is a two seat mid-engine super car that competes in size and style with core offerings from the most notable of Italian exotic car makes, but with a segment leading 650hp and 630 lb-ft of torque provided by a Saleen 5.0L Supercharged Engine - the source of the S5S designation. Unlike its competitors, the Raptor is designed to digest cellulosic ethanol. With ethanol power, the car is both mean and clean!

As power is nothing without control, the double wishbone suspension and rack-and-pinion steering of the S5S is augmented by ABS traction control and stability control systems. The brake system features 15-inch front rotors with 6 piston calipers, and 13-inch rear rotors with dual piston calipers for maximum stopping power. Road holding traction is provided by the 275/35 ZR20 and 315/35/ZR20 Pirelli Rosso tires that wrap the 20" forged aluminum front and rear wheels respectively.

The aesthetics for the Raptor were developed by ASC Creative

Services, America's largest independent automotive design firm.

According to Saleen executives, the S5S Raptor could enter the market in as little as two years, and should it go forward, it would carry a base price of approximately \$185,000 MSRP.

## Saleen Inc Shows Gurney Edition H281 S/C

**March 19, 2008** - The Gurney Signature Edition vehicle will feature Saleen's 465 HP supercharged 281 cubic inch engine, short throw shifter, and 3.73 Max Grip rear axle. In addition, the vehicles will have custom two-tone seats that feature either blue or red Alcantara™ inserts. The legendary Gurney Eagle® logo is featured on the steering wheel and several other places around the car.

The exterior reflects the look of Dan's 1969 Trans Am series Mustang, recreated in a fashion that honors history but looks aggressively towards the future. It features heritage style Gurney Edition body kit with "duck bill" rear spoiler and "stinger" style hood.

In honor of Mr. Gurney's All American Racer persona the cars will be offered in only Torch Red, Performance White, and the feature color Vista Blue. One hundred of each color will be made with contrasting color graphics and interiors, and a set of "#2" roundels to truly relive the Gurney experience.

The show was opened with a Friday evening Pony Trail through a beautiful mix of residential houses, cornfields,

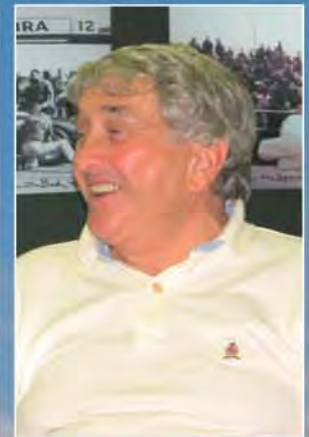

# Saleen Troy Open House

As part of the Woodward Dream Cruise, held in the communities north of Detroit, Michigan, the Saleen Troy Facility held their Sixth Annual Open House.

Visitors were treated to guided tours through the assembly line and paint facilities. On the line were Mustangs and F150 Trucks, going through their Saleen transformation. Mustangs and trucks share the same line. The same technicians perform the modifications on each vehicle, as they are mixed in the line.

Saleen's partnership with Ford produced the Ford GT. This production has been completed and Saleen Troy is now working on Ford Harley-

Davidson F150 Trucks. Customers wishing to have their Harley-Davidson Truck supercharged, simply order the Saleen Supercharger Upfit Ship Thru Codes and the truck is sent to Saleen Troy to receive its complete "Turnkey Package" backed by a Saleen Limited Powertrain Warranty - three years/36,000 miles. The cost for this package is \$6,500.00 MSRP. The spec. page states: "Handover the already potent Ford Harley-Davidson F150 to the race-bred experts at Saleen, and they turn loose 450 hp of supercharged thunder."

Another project being done at Saleen Troy is the work on the 1932 Ford 75th Anniversary Deuce, officially licensed, Limited Edition of 100 vehicles being

produced by Detroit Street Rods, LLC. A surprising project being done at Saleen Troy is the painting of the body parts for the new Dodge Viper. Each car's parts are grouped together on painting racks and sent through the painting department. Once completed, the fully painted body parts are shipped to the Viper assembly plant. To highlight Saleen's work on the Viper, one completed SRT-10 Viper, with a Saleen window band was on display. What an unusual site!

Saleen Troy's original name was SSV, Saleen Special Vehicles. This described their unique role in the automotive industry. They do a variety of specialty work.

Upon entering the Conservator's Class, we received a Conservator's Class plaque with our Conservator's Number 34. At each show we can now earn a plate to be placed on the plaque. When we have earned ten of these plates, we will earn an engraved silver cup.

Saturday evening's dinner was followed by the club's version of "Saturday Night Live". The show featured skits and karaoke acts including the Village Idiots and Mop Lady. Jeff Barnes sang Allen Jackson's song entitled "Drive". Another local group,

the Jeremy Graham Band, sang their song entitled "Remembering Heroes", a tribute to those heroes of 9-11. The main attraction was an excellent show by an Elvis entertainer. The Augusta club has become famous for their spectacular Saturday evening shows. This year's version upheld their reputation.

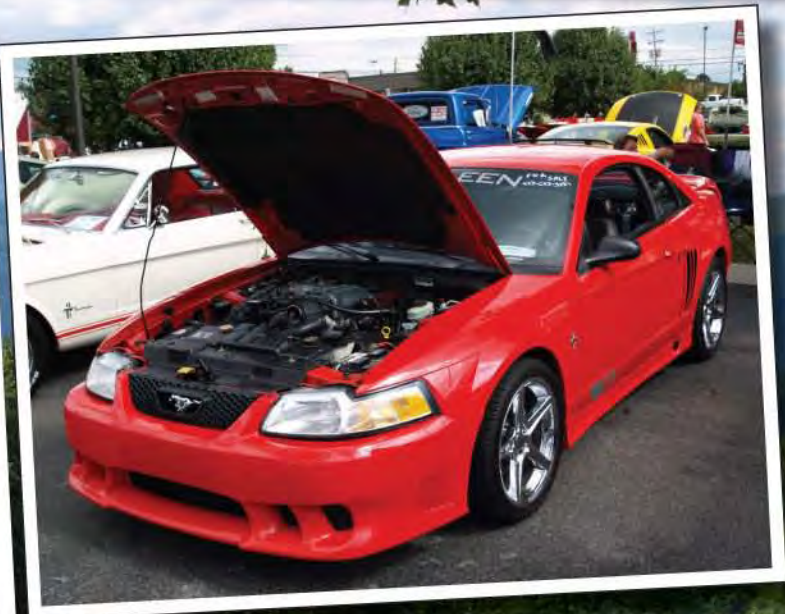
The Saturday and Sunday event was held at the Country Inn and Suites.

At this show the 2007 & 2008 Mustangs were judged for quality, cleanliness, and workmanship. This was a pleasant surprise. Sometimes when the cars are judged by participant vote, cars from out of the area get overlooked in favor of the familiar local cars. If you have a show that includes LMA popular voting, consider judging the LMA class for quality, cleanliness, and workmanship. Get new car owners in the habit of detailing their cars. If you can see the dirt, clean it.

The afternoon was the usual wait for the visit from the judges. The evening agenda was a dinner and show at

Hoot N' Holler. The building was built to look like it was upside down. The show featured audience participation on stage, comedy, juggling, singing, and dancing. The waitresses even got into the act.

This trip was a side trip on our way from Pennsylvania to Florida. The Pigeon Forge Smokey Mountain Area could well be a destination point to spend a full week visiting the many attractions: Dollywood, Elvis Museum, Fast Track, Indoor Skydiving Simulator, Jurassic Jungle Boat Ride, and many more. If you don't have to worry about children in school, September is a good time to get bargain rates on lodging. One sign advertised suites for \$34.99 a night. To commemorate 25 years of producing high performance specialty vehicles, Saleen unveiled the Sterling Edition S302E. This 25 unit limited edition version of the Saleen flagship car will deliver the patented blend of Saleen style, performance and exclusivity that can only be rivaled by Saleen’s own S7.

“The Sterling Edition S302E is the cream of the crop,” said Saleen General Manager, Marques McCammon. “Saleen is about details and we left none to chance when we created this car. From the hand painted graphics, to the 16 oz genuine sterling silver serialized dash plaque, this car has it all. This is the very definition of a 100-point car.”

### Exterior

Each badge is brushed billet, milled with the 25th Anniversary wreath. The car rides on unique 20 inch forged aluminum alloy wheels with a state of the art Durabright™ corrosion resistant coating. The hand painted gunsight exterior accent aims your attention from the rear of the car to the 25th Anniversary wreath that adorns the hood. The Saleen engineered front carbon wind splitter and rear air diffuser were designed to enhance the aerodynamics of the vehicle. The vehicles sub 4 second 0-60 performance is arrested by massive 15 inch cross-drilled vented rotors that are also unique to the “Sterling Edition”.



### Interior

The interior of the car is wrapped in luxurious black Alcantara and leather, with silver accent stitching on the door inserts, dash and center console. To commemorate the 25th anniversary, a genuine sterling silver serialized medallion adorns the instrument panel. To insure that the driver can always stay connected, it includes a navigation system and iPod connector.

The car's 620 horses are called into action at the simple

push of a button by virtue of the console mounted push button starter, offered for the first time on an E car in this special edition model.

“We are anticipating a momentous year, beginning with our “Sterling Edition”. We are working on some very exciting projects and are prepared to deliver exceptional, innovative vehicles to the market,” said Chris Theodore, Saleen’s Vice Chairman and Chief Technical Officer.



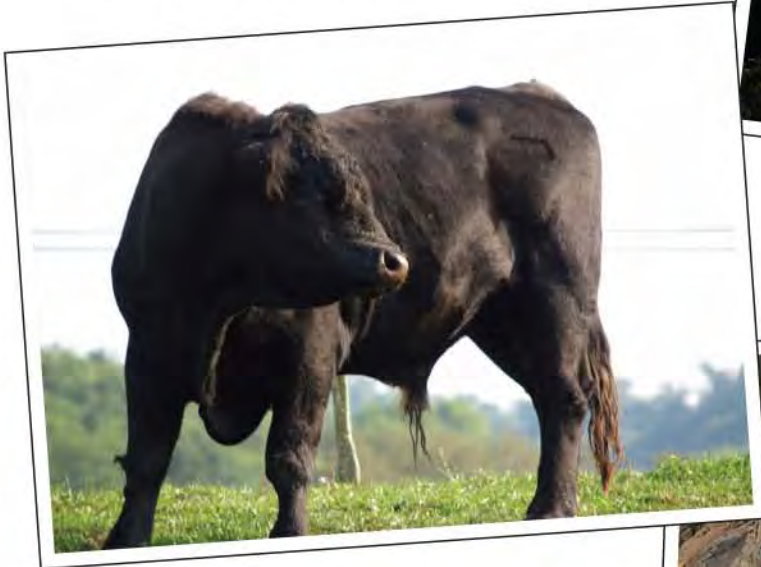


**The Great Smokey Mountains:
